I'm back home for Christmas now and have finally got some time to let you know how my US experience has been so far. The first 4 and a half months of my stay in the US has been a really terrific time. I've really enjoyed being over there, living in a different country, meeting new people, being part of a college team in a professional sporting set up and pursuing a degree. Surprisingly having the motivation to do well at studies to keep playing has worked wonders as I'm on around a 4.0 average. Being in a small town with little to do except train and study has also helped.

Coming into a soccer team and living with other players has helped to settle in as I was instantly part of a social group. Coach Chapman has been really helpful in all ways including setting up the accommodation and helping me settle in. I've become very independent and am running our house which I'm sharing with a few of the other players. I've been doing most of the cooking which I'm enjoying as the other boys have no idea, but I'm teaching them. It's been good however to have a break from it since I've been home, probably my only break as it will be my last time home for at least the next year as the airfares in peak times are so expensive and I also want to spend time with my new friends over there in their home towns. I've made some really good friends and spent Thanksgiving with one of them in his home town of Roseburg in southern Oregon. It was a really good experience.

Soccer was a bit up and down for me. I had a few injuries before I left Perth so I was a bit underdone but I had a really good preseason and got a starting spot in the centre of defence. We lost our first few preseason games but then hit a long winning streak. Unfortunately about a third of the way through the season I had a slight hamstring strain and pulled out of the team. I was in rehab for only 2 weeks but then couldn't get my spot back as we continued winning and got ranked #1 in the NWAACC. That was a very frustrating period for me as I was working really hard to get my spot back but couldn't get the opportunity. However, I kept working really hard and a few games after being ranked #1 we had a poor run where we only won 1 game in 6 and dropped to #3 ranking. I finally got my starting spot back and helped the team get back on track to win the West Division Conference for the third time in 4 years and again qualify for the NWAACC finals. We won our quarter final 2-1 at home and then went to Seattle for the final four playoffs and won our semi-final 1-0 to reach Peninsula Colleges first ever final. We would meet Highline College who finished the conference season ranked #1. Highline were also in the West Division Conference and beat us in both our previous games. Something completely different for me was to play in snow as light snow fell throughout the first half of the final. In what was a game of the defences and we played out a 0-0 draw after extra time so the game went to penalties and we won 5-4 to claim Peninsula Colleges first ever NWAACC Championship. It was the best feeling and to get back into the team and be part of it was terrific. Playing 2 games in 2 days including extra time was pretty tough though. But with all the extra training I did to get back into the starting line-up worked and I got through it.

The amount of training we do is full on, twice a day in preseason and 5-6 days a week plus 1 or 2 games during the season. I also did extra sessions myself in the gym to get stronger and I actually put on 5kg of muscle in 4 months. Hopefully this extra bulk and strength will help me avoid getting injured in the future.

Anyway, it ended up being a very successful season for myself and the team. Interestingly, apart from the preseason games, I didn't play in a losing game all season.

I wanted to let you know about my experience with NSR Soccer Australia.

My son Justin Wolstenholme (born in 1993) is an Elite Soccer player who played in the NSW Premier League in his early youth years. Through his performances Justin gained numerous representative selections. Justin was in the NSW State Team that won the National Australian Youth Championships (he scored the first 2 goals in the Grand Final), was awarded a soccer scholarship with the NSW Institute of Sport and was also a member of the Sydney FC Academy squad. Justin also participated in an International Soccer Tournament in South Korea with the NSW Institute of Sport playing against teams from Japan, France, Spain, South Korea, Russia and China where his team reached the Grand Final of the Tournament.

With Justin being such a gifted soccer player we were keen to provide him with the best opportunity to continue to build on his talents. We undertook a great deal of research and looked at numerous options. In the end we decided to go with NSR Soccer Australia as we saw the U.S. College soccer system as an outstanding soccer development program that also provided a first class tertiary education outcome.

With NSR Soccer Australia not being a local option in NSW (as it's not endorsed by Football NSW) we needed to work through NSR Soccer Australia in Melbourne. Our experience working with Marco Maisano at NSR Soccer Australia was brilliant. Marco kept us fully informed and helped us work through the entire process from start to finish. telephone during this time, but it was almost daily in the final few months. I actually don't know how he does it; with the time differences he speaks with the Coaches at night and then with his Australian clients (like us) during the day, it's quite staggering.

In the end Marco had a number of firm offers from U.S. NCAA Division 1 Universities for us to consider. Marco helped answer all our questions on each of these Universities and also provided us with additional web links with further information that helped us make our choice. Justin decided to accept an offer with the University of Cincinnati, due in part to their unique early Spring intake option. Justin arrived at the University in late March this year and has settled in very well. He is part of a squad of 28 players and the standard and talent of the players is exceptionally high. In the squad is a player who is in the Canadian under 20 National Team, one who is in the Jamaican under 20 National team and 2 players who are expected to be called up to the U.S. National under 20 team. It's for these reasons that we are confident that we have made the right choice for Justin's ongoing soccer development. He's in a team with exceptionally talented players, trains 6 days a week, has 5 full time coaching staff and facilities that are simply 2<sup>nd</sup> to none. In a highly competitive and focused environment such as this where Justin trains almost every day with players older than him that push his fitness, speed and strength, he is continuing to develop at a rapid rate.

We are delighted with our decision and we couldn't have achieved this without Marco and NSR Soccer Australia.
