

E-Series Club Cup Rules of Competition

Article 1 - Competition Format

- 1. All Football West clubs in the state of Western Australia may enter the E-Series Club Cup.
- 2. The competition will be run in two divisions, one for each platform. They will be the PS4 Division and the Xbox Division.
- 3. Football West may divide the competition into a Men's, a Women's and Junior competition.
- 4. To play in the Junior competition the player must be eligible to compete in a Football West U/16's competition. For clarity this does not include any player who receives an exemption to compete in these age groups.
- 5. The Junior competition may be divided into a Boy's and Girl's competition.
- 6. The tournament will be an elimination tournament with the draw to be performed on 23 March 2020.
- 7. Each round will include a draw to determine the fixtures for that round.
- 8. The players competing in each round of the competition in each division will be drawn in pairs at random.
- 9. Football West will determine the number of rounds and the number of byes to be included based on the number of entries received.
- 10. The final two competitors in each division will receive entry into the National Level Competition with details to be determined.

Article 2 - Fixturing

- 1. Following the draw Football West will determine the date and time limit for completion of all matches in the round.
- 2. If a match is not completed by the determined time then the result will be recorded as a forfeit for both teams unless:
 - a. The failure to complete the match is not the fault of one competitor in which case a forfeit will be entered for the other team; or
 - b. The failure to complete the match is not the fault of both competitors in which case Football West may provide an extension of time in order to complete the match.
- 3. For the quarter finals onwards Football West will set a date and time for the match to take place in order to allow for broadcast of the match.

Article 3 - Equipment

- 1. Each club is responsible for ensuring that the competitors have access to the required equipment to enter the tournament.
- 2. The tournament will require either an Xbox One or PlayStation 4 based on the divisions which are entered.
- 3. An internet connection will also be required.
- 4. Football West will not provide any of the required equipment and is not responsible for damage to any of the equipment.

Article 4 – Match Settings

- 1. The settings for each match are as follows:
 - Game Mode: Friendly
 - Match Length: 6 Minute Halves
 - Difficulty: World Class
 - Injuries: On

Offside: On Handball: Off

• In the event of a draw: Extra Time and then Penalties

2. Players may select any club team to control during their match. For clarity a club team means a club side that completes in any country's league but does not include international sides (such as Australia) or FIFA 20 generated squads (such as the Classic XI)

Article 5 - Match Documentation

- 1. Following competition of the match both players must take a screenshot or photograph of the result.
- 2. The results form available on the Football West E-Series Club Cup must be completed and submitted to Football West by midnight of the day on which the match is completed.
- 3. A results form submitted without the picture referred to in paragraph 1 will not be accepted.
- 4. Football West may take whatever action it deems necessary if there is a dispute about the result.

Article 6 - Livestreaming

- The competition may be livestreamed on a competitor's personal channel or YouTube page but the title of the stream must be Football West E-Series Club Cup Club of Player 1 Vs Club of Player 2
- 2. Notice should be sent to Football West indicating that the match is intended to be livestreamed.
- 3. Each match beginning in the quarter-final round onwards will be livestreamed on the Football West Twitch account.

Article 7 - Discipline

- 1. Clubs and Competitors should be aware that the Football West Code of Conduct and the Disciplinary and Grievance Regulations apply to this competition.
- 2. Football West may also take action if it has reason to believe that any conduct bringing the tournament into disrepute has taken place.
