All Matches will be played in accordance with the FIFA Laws of the Game in force at the time of publication of these rules and as laid down by the International Football Association Board, unless otherwise stated in these rules.

A Club which affiliates with FA and enters Teams into the National Premier Leagues WA Competition is deemed to accept these Competition Rules.

Definitions & Interpretation

The definitions set out in the Disciplinary and Grievance Regulations apply to this document except for those definitions set out below:

In these Rules, the following words have the meaning ascribed to them:

- a) **Application** means the application lodged by each Club seeking inclusion in the NPLWA Competition;
- b) **Business Day** means a day other than a Saturday, a Sunday or a public holiday in Western Australia;
- c) **Club** means a Club registered with FA in accordance with the National Registration, Status and Transfer Regulations and accepted by Football West into the NPL-WA Competition;
- d) **Competition Season** means any series of competitive Matches in the NPL-WA Competition within one calendar year;
- e) **D&G Tribunal or Tribunal** means the means the tribunal established by Football West pursuant to the Disciplinary & Grievance Regulations;
- f) **FA** means Football Australia;
- g) **FIFA** means Fédération Internationale de Football Association;
- h) **Football West Constitution** means the constitution of Football West Limited as adopted on 6 July 2004 and subsequently amended from time to time and published on the Football West website;
- i) **Match** means any game of football conducted by or under the control of Football West which is part of the NPLWA Competition;
- j) **NPL Juniors** means the Under 13s, Under 14s, Under 15s and Under 16s of any one Club.
- k) **NPL Seniors** means the First Team, Under 21s, Under 20s and Under 18s of any one Club.
- l) **NPLWA Competition** means the National Premier Leagues – WA Competition operated and administered by Football West and consisting of the NPLWA-M and NPLWA-W as well as the NPL Juniors;
- m) **NPLWA-M** means the National Premier Leagues – WA Men’s Competition operated and administered by Football West;
- n) **NPLWA-W** means the National Premier Leagues – WA Women’s Competition operated and administered by Football West;
- o) **Regular Season** means the home and away league season and does not include pre-season, friendly or cup games.
- p) **Representative Match** means representative games for State Teams, including School Sport WA.
- q) **Team** means any one or more of the group of Players, which represents the Club (whether formally or informally) in the NPLWA Competition, as determined by Football West;
- r) **Top Four Cup** means the end of season playoff Competition set out in Part 3 for the NPLWA-M and Part 5 for the NPLWA-W;
- s) **National Finals Series** means the end of season playoff Competition conducted by FA between National Premier League sides from across Australia;
- t) **Promotion and Relegation Playoff** means the playoff series set out in Article 23.
- u) **Player Roster** means the list of Players registered to an NPLWA-M Team as eligible to play for that Team in compliance with the Player Points System and other requirements;
- v) **Player Roster Composition** means the list of Players registered to an NPLWA-W Team as eligible to play for that Team and complying with the various requirements of that list.

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Part 1 – Common Rules

Article 1 - General

1. Football West may at any time alter, add to, clarify or delete any of these Rules at its discretion. Any changes to these Rules will be communicated to each Club.
2. The Rules contained within this document apply to and are valid for all Football West National Premier Leagues Competitions.
3. Where a Rule in this document appears to be in conflict with a Rule in an Annexure, the Rule in the Annexure will take precedence.
4. Where a Rule in this Part 1 appears to be in conflict with a Rule in any other Part of this document which deals with a specific Competition (for example the Part dealing with the NPL Juniors Competitions) then the Part dealing with the specific Competition takes precedence.
5. Any action, direction or decision that Football West may undertake under these Rules (including but not limited to any action, direction, determination or decision) may be done, given or made, as the case may be, in Football West's sole and absolute discretion unless explicitly stated to the contrary.
6. For the purposes of these Rules, the term "Senior Teams" refers to the NPLWA-M First Team, the Under 20s Team and the Under 18s Team and the NPLWA-W First Team and Under 21s Team. The term "Junior Teams" refers to those Teams in the Under 13s to Under 16s age groups inclusive.
7. Notwithstanding any other Rule in any Competition, Football West may investigate any alleged breach of these Rules, and in doing so may rely on any information or document that it deems relevant in its absolute discretion. Whether a matter is investigated or not is entirely at the discretion of Football West.
8. A participant who breaches any of these Rules or those Rules in the accompanying Annexures is liable to a Penalty. Football West reserves the right, in its sole and absolute discretion to:
 - a) issue a warning for any breach of a Rule prior to the imposition of any Penalties;
 - b) impose a Penalty or not; or
 - c) reduce or vary a Penalty

by written notification to the relevant participant under this paragraph. Any decision to impose a Penalty may not be appealed to the Tribunal on the basis that Football West has exercised this discretion.

9. Football West may vary, revoke or rescind any decision it makes under paragraph 8 at its discretion and for any reason, including if new evidence that was not available to Football West at the time that the decision was made arises and this may only occur within 5 Business Days of the decision being made under paragraph 8.
10. Where a Penalty is not specified in these Rules, Football West reserves the right to use its discretion to determine and impose a Penalty.

11. Where a Rule is capable of more than one interpretation, Football West reserves the right (in its sole discretion) to determine which interpretation applies and accordingly, whether to impose a Penalty or not. Any such determination is final.
12. Football West reserves the right (in its sole direction) to make a ruling on any circumstance or scenario that is not governed by these Rules. Any ruling made by Football West pursuant to this paragraph 12 is final.
13. A Club may apply for and Football West will consider, an application by a Club for an exemption to these rules where it can demonstrate that exceptional circumstances exist. Football West will determine (in its sole discretion) whether or not the circumstances warrant any exemption applied for. Any such determination is final and not subject to any further review or challenge.
14. A Club's identity may not comprise of any part of a Player's attire, or a uniform worn by a Club Official which incorporates national flags, slogans or emblems which, in the opinion of Football West, breach the Inclusivity Principles (as published by Football Australia) or offend the spirit of the Inclusivity Principles or bring the FA or Football West into disrepute.
15. Football West may, from time to time, organise Matches outside the normal league and cup seasons between the winning Team of any division and another Team from Western Australia, another Member Federation or another National Association. It is a condition of entry into the NPLWA that if such a Match is organised, the Team chosen must participate in that Match. Failure to do so may incur a Penalty as set out in Appendix A
16. Should a vacant position for an additional Team arise in any Division of any Competition for any reason prior to the commencement of a Competition Season the vacancy may be filled through a process to be determined by Football West in consultation with the relevant Standing Committee.
17. The right to enter a Team in a certain Division belongs to the Club rather than the Players of any particular Team.
18. In the event any Competition Season, including the NPL seasons, must be cancelled for any reason at any point Football West has complete discretion to declare a Team the winner of that Competition or declare that there is no winner of the relevant Competition for that Season.
19. In the event any Competition Season, including the NPL seasons, must be modified at any point in time and for any reason, Football West may, and in its complete discretion declare that the Competitions are to be conducted under a modified set of Rules or fixtures published by Football West at that time.
20. Each Club acknowledges that it is not entitled to rely upon a Match Official's interpretation of these Rules, and that these Rules are distinct from and in addition to the FIFA Laws of the Game.
21. A Club is not able to compete in the NPL Juniors Competitions if that Club participates in, or is promoted to, a Senior NPL Competition.

Article 2 - Competition Points

1. Three (3) points will be awarded to the Team who wins a Match, one (1) point each for Teams who end a Match in a draw and no points are awarded to a Team for a defeat.
2. If two or more Teams are equal on points on completion of the Competition Season, the following criteria will be applied to determine the higher-ranking Team in the following order:
 - a) superior goal difference;
 - b) higher number of goals scored;
 - c) number of points gained in Matches between the Teams concerned;
 - d) superior goal difference in Matches between the Teams concerned;
 - e) greater number of goals scored away from home in Matches between the Teams concerned;
 - f) lower number of Red Cards;
 - g) lower number of Yellow Cards; or
 - h) drawing of lots in accordance with a procedure to be determined by Football West in its absolute discretion.

Article 3 - Matches

1. All NPLWA Matches must be played on grass or an artificial surface that has been approved in writing by Football West.
2. Subject to paragraph 4, the venues, dates and times of Matches will be fixed and published by Football West as soon as practicable prior to the commencement of each Competition Season, and except as otherwise provided in these Rules, Matches will be played at those venues and on those dates as published on Football West's website.
3. Each Club is required to participate in its allocated Matches unless otherwise specified in these Rules. Penalty for a breach of this Article is as set out in Appendix A.
4. Football West reserves the right to change the date, time and venue of any Match. Football West may consult with and take into account any representations made by a Club participating in the Match in question, and with any other Club or Clubs which may be affected before doing so.
5. In the event that a Team is not ready to commence the Match within 15 minutes following the scheduled kick-off time, the Match must not proceed. Penalty for a breach of this Article is as set out in Appendix A.
6. A Match may be played wholly or partly under floodlights if the floodlight installation has been approved by Football West as suitable for the conduct of Matches in the Competition in which the Match will take place. The Match Official may determine at any point immediately prior to or during the Match whether the lighting is adequate for the relevant Match (including Player safety) and may determine whether the Match is to proceed on this basis.
7. In the event of inclement weather:
 - a) The Referee and Clubs must reach a consensus as to whether the safety of the Players, Club Officials, Match Officials and spectators will be compromised by commencing or continuing a Match in such circumstances;

- b) the Referee will exercise his or her discretion as to whether a Match may proceed in accordance with sub-paragraph (a).
8. A Club must use all reasonable endeavours to ensure that all reasonable steps are taken to ensure that its home venue (including stadiums, change facilities and grounds) can facilitate the safe conduct of a scheduled Match during adverse weather conditions.
 9. In the event that a Match is ended in a manner inconsistent with Competition Rules, (including for example, by extra time rather than proceeding directly to kicks from the Penalty mark, or vice versa, Football West reserves the right to allow the Match result to stand, as long as Football West is satisfied (in its absolute discretion) that the Match was concluded in a manner consistent with the FIFA Laws of the Game. If Football West determines that allowing the Match result to stand would result in an unfair result, the entire Match will be replayed. The decision of Football West in these circumstances is final and cannot be challenged.
 10. It is the responsibility of the home Club to ensure that prior to the Match, the Referee has sufficient time to conduct a ground inspection, which may include but is not limited to inspection of the goal nets, the line markings and the state of repair of the ground more generally. The Referee may, in that Referee's discretion, deem a ground not fit for purpose and elect to abandon the Match. In such a scenario, the Referee must inform Football West of this occurrence to which Football West may propose remedial action, including but not limited to imposition of sanctions on the relevant Club.
 11. Nets affixed to goalposts must be used in all NPLWA Matches. The Referee must not allow the Match to proceed without nets.
 12. The Club whose name appears first in any Match is deemed to be the home Team regardless of the venue at which the Match is played. Any reference in these Rules to a "Home Club" is to be interpreted in accordance with this Article.
 13. A Match must not proceed or continue if either Team is reduced to fewer than 7 Players.
 14. Football West may designate Matches to be livestreamed by Football West or by a third-party with approval from Football West. Football West may impose such conditions as it sees fit on the livestreaming of any Match.
 15. The livestreaming of any Match must:
 - a) not promote unhealthy dietary choices;
 - b) comply with state or federal laws (such as tobacco advertising);
 - c) comply with Football West Rules, Regulations and By-Laws; or
 - d) not relate or refer to products, brands or companies which are, in Football West's sole opinion, in conflict with Football West sponsors or damage the reputation of the league or Football West.
 16. All footage supplied to Football West post-streaming must not include watermarks or any other graphical overlays.
 17. Commentary used in any livestream must not breach the Football West or FA Code of Conduct and Ethics.

Article 4 – Postponed, Delayed, Suspended or Abandoned Matches

1. A Match must not be postponed except with the prior written consent of Football West.
2. A Match must not be suspended except:
 - a) on the instructions of the Referee;
 - b) by order of the police or other relevant authority exercising its statutory powers to that effect;
or
 - c) on the instructions of, or with the prior written consent of Football West.
3. A Match must not be delayed or abandoned except on the instructions of the Referee.
4. If the appointed Referee delays, suspends or abandons a Match, the Referee must, within 30 minutes of making such a decision, inform:
 - a) the home Club;
 - b) the visiting Club; and
 - c) the Football West Referees Department.
5. A Match postponed in accordance with paragraph 1 may only be replayed at a date and time mutually agreed by both Clubs except in the circumstances specified in paragraphs 7 and 8. The details of the rearranged Match must be communicated to Football West at least 3 Business Days prior to the Match.
6. If a Club requests the postponement of a Match, Football West reserves the right to require that an alternative date, time and venue are agreed before any such request is granted.
7. If a Match is postponed and the Clubs involved are not able to reach an agreement as to when the Match will be played, Football West will determine the date, time and venue of the Match and any such decision is final. If the rescheduled Match incurs a cost, Football West may pass on that cost to either one or both participating Clubs depending on the circumstances which led to the postponement.
8. If a postponed Match cannot be rescheduled in accordance with paragraph 7, or cannot be completed for any other reason, Football West reserves the right to declare the Match a 0-0 draw.
9. If a Match is abandoned for any reason prior to half time, then the Match will be replayed, unless, in the opinion of the Referee, one or both of the participating Teams have caused or contributed to the abandonment of the Match or unless otherwise specified in these Rules.
10. If a Match is abandoned at half time or after the commencement of the second half, then the score at the time of the abandonment of the Match will be deemed to be the Match result, unless, in the opinion of the Referee, one or both of the participating Teams or a Club Associate from one of the participating Teams caused or contributed to the abandonment of the Match. If the Referee does not express an opinion on the party responsible for the abandonment, Football West may make a decision as to which party or parties are responsible for the abandonment.
11. If a Match is abandoned, and that Match is one where an outcome must be determined (for example a knock out cup Match) and at the time of the abandonment scores are level, then that Match will be replayed in full, unless in the opinion of the Referee, one or both of the participating Teams or a

Club Associate from one or both of the participating Teams caused or contributed to the abandonment of the Match. If the Referee does not express an opinion on the party responsible for the abandonment, Football West may make a decision as to which party or parties are responsible for the abandonment and may impose a penalty on one or both Clubs, or Players or impose some other remedial action for the offending party.

12. An abandoned Match which is to be replayed may be arranged at a mutually convenient time and venue by the participating Clubs. Football West must be notified in writing of the date, time and venue of the rescheduled Match at least 3 Business Days prior to the rescheduled kick-off time.
13. If an abandoned Match cannot be rescheduled through mutual agreement within a reasonable time determined by Football West, Football West will determine the new date, time and venue of the Match and any such decision will be final. If the rescheduled Match incurs a cost, Football West may pass on that cost to either one or both of the participating Clubs depending on the circumstances which led to the abandonment.
14. If an abandoned Match cannot be rescheduled in accordance with paragraph 13, Football West reserves the right to declare the Match a 0-0 draw. If the abandoned Match is one where an outcome must be determined, Football West reserves the right to determine the outcome of the Match using any method it chooses.

Article 5 - Forfeited Matches

1. A Team that forfeits a Match (or is deemed to have forfeited) may be sanctioned with a Penalty specified in Appendix B at the discretion of Football West.
2. Nothing in paragraph 1 prevents Football West from also issuing a breach notice under the NPL Compliance Regulations for a forfeit of a Match. Football West may also choose to issue a breach notice under the NPL Compliance Regulations rather than an infringement notice under paragraph 1.
3. The result of a forfeited Match will be awarded to the opposition Team by a margin of 3-0, unless that score disadvantages the non-offending Team, for example in circumstances where the non-offending Team has a margin of goals greater than three (3).
4. If a Team that forfeits three (3) consecutive Matches or any four (4) Matches during a Competition Season, Football West may at its absolute discretion, deem that relevant Team to have withdrawn from the Competition.
5. In circumstances in which Football West determines that both Teams participating in a Match commit a breach of any Rule which carry the sanction of a forfeit, Football West reserves the right to declare the Match played, and award each Team zero points and zero goals, or if that Match occurs in a knockout Competition, disqualify both Teams from that Competition.
6. In circumstances where a Team is retrospectively penalised with forfeiting a Match or forfeits during the Match, all Match data resulting from the Match will be retained. This data includes, but is not limited to:
 - a) goals scored (with the exception of those scored by an ineligible Player);
 - b) Fairest and Best votes (with the exception of those earned by an ineligible Player);

- c) substitutions;
- d) Yellow cards; and
- e) Red cards.

7. Notwithstanding paragraph 6, Match data directly related to the conduct of a Player will not be retained if Football West determines that the relevant player caused or contributed to the relevant Team forfeiting the Match will not be retained. For example, if a Player who is under suspension scores a goal in a Match, and that Player is responsible for conduct which leads to that Team forfeiting the Match, that goal will not be counted towards that Player's Season goal tally.

Article 6 - Playing Strip

1. Each Player's playing shirt, including the goalkeeper's shirt, must display on its back a unique number which is clearly distinguishable from a reasonable distance. The number must be a whole number between 1 and 99. Penalty per breach of this Article is as set out in Appendix A.
2. The number 1 may only be worn by a goalkeeper. A substitute goalkeeper must have a unique number on the back of their shirt. That is, where a Team has a substitute goalkeeper, the substitute goalkeeper must not have the same number as the starting goalkeeper.
3. Each Player's shirt must display the NPL Logo on the right chest in accordance with instructions issued by Football West. For the avoidance of doubt, this requirement applies to both the home strip and the change strip for NPLWA-M and NPLWA-W First Teams only.
4. Nothing may be placed on a Player's playing shirt that covers any part of the NPL Logo. This particularly applies to captain's armbands or black armbands.
5. No part of the Player's attire or the uniform worn by a Club Official may incorporate national flags, slogans, or emblems.
6. The home Team will wear its designated home strip unless an exemption is granted by Football West in writing or if otherwise provided for in these Rules.
7. Advertising on a strip is permitted except for:
 - a) advertisements which contravene state or federal laws (such as tobacco advertising);
 - b) advertisements which contravene Football West or Football Australia Rules, Regulations and By-Laws; or
 - c) or advertisements which relate or refer to products, brands or companies which are, in Football West's sole opinion, in direct conflict with Football West sponsors or damage the reputation of the league or Football West or Football Australia.
8. In respect of any strip worn by Players under the age of 18, no advertising relating to alcoholic beverages may appear on the playing strip of those Players. Football West reserves the right to require that any such sponsorship advertising is removed from a playing strip if it deems the advertisement breaches this Rule.

Article 7 - Match Officials

1. A Referee arranged by the home Club in accordance with these Rules in the absence of an officially appointed Referee assumes the same powers and responsibilities as an official Referee for the duration of the Match.
2. A Referee or assistant Referee arranged by the home Club in accordance with these rules in the absence of an officially appointed Referee, must be at least as old as the youngest eligible Player for the Competition.
3. Players and Technical Area occupants must identify themselves to the Match Officials upon request during, immediately before and immediately after a Match. Penalty per breach is as set out in Appendix A
4. Players and Team Officials must comply with any lawful instruction given to them by a Match Official officiating at an NPLWA Match. Penalty per breach is as set out in Appendix A
5. Neither Players nor Team Officials may approach a Match Official at any time before, during or after the Match unless invited to do so by the relevant Match Official.
6. Match officials must not officiate a Match in cases where the Match Official has an existing or potential conflict of interest in respect of that Match, or the Teams or Players involved in it. Any such conflict must be immediately disclosed to Football West prior to commencement of a Match. If there is any doubt as to whether or not any such conflict exists, the Match Official must declare it.
7. Each Club acknowledges and agrees that actual or perceived conflicts of interest arise if Match Officials have, or appear to have, private or personal interests that detract from their ability to perform their duties as Match Officials with integrity in an independent and purposeful manner. Private or personal interests include gaining any possible advantage for himself or herself, his or her family, relatives, friends or acquaintances.
8. If a Club believes that a Match Official has an actual or perceived conflict of interest it may report the matter to Football West and if the Club chooses to report it, the Club must provide detailed reasons for the alleged conflict of interest. Any reports of alleged conflict which do not contain detailed reasons for the allegation will be dismissed immediately.
9. In the event that a conflict of interest, either actual or perceived, comes to the attention of Football West, Football West may make a determination (in its absolute discretion) on whether that conflict of interest exists. If Football West determines that a conflict of interest exists or has existed, Football West may make any director or determination that it sees fit in the circumstances, including that it may order the replay of the Match or determine that a forfeit is to be imposed (but is not limited to these outcomes). Football West may determine the action or direction to be taken or made at its own and final discretion.
10. Neither Players nor Team Officials may approach a Match Official before, during or after a Match has ended unless invited to do so by the relevant Match Official.
11. The decisions of the Referee regarding facts connected with play, including whether or not a goal is scored and the result of the Match, are final, even if the decision(s) of the Referee represents a technical error in the Laws of the Game.

Article 8 - Match Documentation

1. All NPLWA Competitions will use Electronic Match Cards.
2. An Electronic Match Card must be completed accurately 15 minutes prior to the commencement of the Match and the penalties set out in Appendix A apply to a breach of this requirement.
3. A Player whose name appears on an Electronic Match Card is deemed to have participated in the Match as either a Player or a named substitute. Players that are named substitutes but do not take the field are still participants but do not count as having taken the field for the purposes of any other Competition Rule.
4. The Team List received by Football West in respect of a Match will be accepted facts relating to that Match.
5. A Club may contact Football West if it believes that the details on the Match documentation have misidentified a goal scorer or substitute.
6. The Goal scorer(s) for a particular fixture as set out on the Electronic Match Card cannot be contested following the commencement of a subsequent round.
7. Any contest of goal scorers or substitutes should be submitted to Football West by the relevant Club prior to the commencement of the subsequent round with evidence of video footage and must include the following details:
 - a) fixture details;
 - b) time of goal scored/substitution;
 - c) name and shirt number of misidentified goal scorer/substitute; and
 - d) name and shirt number of alleged goal scorer/substitute.
8. If there are technical difficulties with the Electronic Match Card system a Team may email Football West with the details of a participant of the Match prior to the scheduled kick off time and Football West may, at its discretion, accept this as a valid Electronic Match Card.

Article 9 - Player Registration & Eligibility

1. If any Player in NPLWA-M or NPLWA-W First Team is a Professional, then that league's registration rules will be conducted in accordance with Professional Registration requirements.
2. Subject to Article 10 paragraph 1, Football West may deem that even if the requirement in paragraph 1 above is not met, a league's registration rules will be conducted in accordance with Professional Registration requirements.
3. Subject to paragraphs 1, 2 or 4 and the relevant Player Rosters rules, an amateur Player may register with an NPLWA Club before **5:00 pm WST on 30 June 2022** in accordance with the National Registration, Status and Transfer Regulations and the FIFA Regulations on the Status and Transfer of Players.
4. An Australian amateur Player who has not previously been registered with an Australian Club in 2022, may register with any Club in accordance with the National Registration, Status and Transfer Regulations and the FIFA Regulations on the Status and Transfer of Players and the relevant Player

Roster rules.

5. A Player must be registered with FA in accordance with the National Registration and Status Regulations to be considered eligible to participate in any competitive Match.
6. A registered Player must not participate in any Match approved by Football West if he or she is suspended or otherwise deemed ineligible by Football West, another Australian Member Federation, FA, AFC or FIFA.
7. It is the responsibility of the Club to ensure that each Player participating in a Match is eligible to do so.
8. The authorised representative of each Club participating in the Match is responsible for satisfying themselves that the opposition Players are properly registered with Football West.
9. Football West reserves the right to allow elite female Players to participate in any male Competition appropriate to their skill level regardless of age or normal eligibility criteria otherwise described in these Rules. In such cases, Football West will determine the most appropriate Competition for those Players on a case-by-case basis.
10. A Player is ineligible to play if that Player:
 - a) is not registered in accordance with the National Registration Regulations; or
 - b) plays for a Club with which the Player is not registered; or
 - c) plays without an ITC (International Transfer Certificate) where one is required; or
 - d) plays within a Stand-Down Period due to a change of status; or
 - e) plays while under suspension; or
 - d) plays while registered for two Clubs at the same time without seeking an exemption to do so (note that the Player is eligible to play for the Club with which he was registered first in these circumstances); or
 - e) does not have proof of registration as described in these rules; or
 - f) plays for a Club, Team or in a Competition when not permitted to do so under these Rules; or
 - g) plays in a Match when not listed on a Team list; or
 - h) plays in a Match in which his or her name has been added to the Team list after the Match has commenced; or
 - i) plays for a Team which causes the maximum number of Players allowed to be listed on a Team list is exceeded; or
 - j) plays under an assumed identity; or
 - k) plays while not eligible to do so for any other reason.
11. If a Player plays in a Match while ineligible, the Club will be liable for a sanction as described in Appendix A of this document. In certain circumstances, as determined by the Football West (in its absolute discretion), a Player may also be sanctioned.

Article 10 - Professional Player Registration Deadlines

1. Professional Players may only be registered during the prescribed registration periods as follows

and in accordance with the National Registration Regulations and the FIFA Regulations on the Status and Transfer of Players:

a) Men:

- i. Between **14 January 2022** and **10 February 10 2022**;
- ii. Between **21 June 2022** and **30 June 2022**;
- iii. As prescribed by FIFA.

b) Women:

- i. Between **15 March 2022** and **12 April 2022**;
- ii. Between **13 June 2022** and **21 June 2022**;
- iii. As prescribed by FIFA.

2. A professional Player may be registered outside a prescribed registration period if the Player is a goalkeeper, and the Club can supply evidence from a certified medical practitioner declaring that the usual goalkeeper is unfit to play at the time of the registration.
3. A Player registered as a Professional in the W-League may re-register as an amateur immediately after their last Match as a Professional on the condition that the playing contract with their associated W-League Club has ended.
4. Paragraph 3 is an exception to the 30-day stand-down period set out in clause 3.3(a) of the National Registration, Status and Transfer Regulations.

Article 11 - Non-Player Registration

1. All coaches, assistant coaches, goalkeeper coaches, Team managers, sports trainers, physiotherapists, or other medical staff in all age groups of all NPLWA Clubs must be registered on PlayFootball. The penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A.
2. Other Team Officials who sit in the Technical Area during any NPLWA Match must be registered on PlayFootball. Where no Technical Area is marked, Team Officials who are actively involved in any NPLWA Match must be registered on PlayFootball. The penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A.

Article 12 - Proof of Registration

1. PlayFootball must be used to generate proof of registration including a Player photograph for every Player participating in a Match.
2. Evidence of registration without a Player's photograph is not acceptable as proof of registration. The Player must be able to be identified from the photograph. A registration without a valid photograph renders the Player ineligible until a valid photograph is added.
3. Each Team must produce proof of registration for any or each of its Players on request from the opposition Club prior to kick-off. This may be produced electronically but must be in a format that

allows the opposition Club to verify the Players identities. For clarity, the preferred format is a pdf version of the Player ID Cards being sent electronically to the opposition Club.

4. If a Club is unable to produce proof of registration for any Player prior to kick-off after being requested to do so by the opposition Club, the Match may proceed. However, the proof of registration must be produced before the end of the Match for that Player(s) to be deemed eligible to participate. If the Club is unable to produce the proof by the end of the Match, that Player(s) will be deemed ineligible.
5. The failure of a Club to produce proof of registration to the opposition Club must be reported to the Referee who must note that failure on the Team List.
6. Proof of registration MAY NOT be requested after the Match has commenced.
7. If a Club has complied with all necessary requirements and wishes to subsequently lodge a protest based on Player eligibility, it must do so in accordance with the conditions specified in the Disciplinary & Grievance Regulations.

Article 13 - Venue

1. The home venue of all Senior NPLWA Clubs must meet the relevant criteria set down by Football West in the NPL Compliance Regulations.
2. The home venue of a NPLWA Junior Club must meet the criteria of a Class D venue as specified in the Football West Competition Management Regulations.
3. Four parking spaces inside the venue must be provided free of charge for Match Officials on Match day for all Matches.
4. A Club may request to change its home ground venue but may do so only by written application to Football West. Football West reserves the right to refuse any application if the facilities do not meet the specified criteria.
5. The home Club, at its own expense, must ensure that a nominated groundskeeper is on duty during all scheduled home Senior NPLWA Matches, commencing at least one hour prior to the first scheduled Match. The penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A.
6. Football West reserves the right to require that its, FA and the NPL's sponsors' signage is prominently displayed at the venue at which any Match is played. A Club and each Team must comply with any lawful direction given by Football West in connection with this paragraph.
7. Football West reserves the right to take whatever action is deemed necessary in the event that NPLWA Matches are affected by changes to the availability of any venue or venues. A Club and each Team must comply with any lawful direction given by Football West in connection with this paragraph.

Article 14 - Technical Areas, Substitutes and Non-Playing Officials

1. A Technical Area must be clearly marked for each Senior NPLWA Match in accordance with the Laws of the Game. Each technical area must have seating for 12 people.
2. All substitutes substituted Players and non-playing officials must remain in the Technical Area while the Match is in progress with the exception of substitutes who are warming up. For the avoidance of doubt, any person who is named on the Team List as either a Player or a non-playing Team Official is required to occupy the Technical Area unless directed otherwise by the Referee or unless warming up if that person is a substitute.
3. Substitutes who are warming up must:
 - a) warm up inside the confines of the perimeter fence;
 - b) wear a bib which is a different colour to both Teams and the Match Officials; and
 - c) not warm up with a football.
4. Each Senior NPLWA Team may nominate a maximum of 7 substitutes.
5. The 2022 Senior NPLWA Competition Season will be conducted under temporarily amended version of the Laws of the Game allowing for 5 substitutes to be made. In Senior NPLWA Matches:
 - a) Each team will be permitted to use a maximum of 5 substitutes.
 - b) To reduce disruption to the match, each team will have a maximum of 3 opportunities to make substitutions during the game; substitutions may also be made at half-time.
 - c) If both teams make a substitution at the same time, this will count as 1 of the 3 opportunities for each team.
 - d) Unused substitutions and opportunities are carried forward into extra time.
 - e) Where competition rules allow an additional substitution in extra time, Teams will each have 1 additional substitution opportunity; substitutions may also be made before the start of extra time and at half-time in extra time.
6. Each Team may nominate a maximum of 5 non-playing Team Officials.

Article 15 – Match Scheduling

1. A schedule of Matches which comprise the NPLWA in each Division will be developed and published by Football West on its website. Football West will not review or consider any dispute in relation to a Match schedule which arises by virtue of a Club making a claim of perceived unfairness.
2. With the exception of abandoned Matches, each period of a Senior NPLWA Match must last for a minimum of 35 minutes in order for a result to be recorded.
3. Subject to paragraph 4, the duration of the half time interval is to be 15 minutes.
4. The Referee must adjust the duration of an Under 21s, Under 20s or Under 18s Match where necessary to ensure that the First Team Match commences at the scheduled kick-off time. The half time interval is to be first shortened. The half time interval must be at least eight (8) minutes long.
5. When a Match is shortened in accordance with paragraph 2, each Match Official is entitled to receive the full amount of their normal Match fee.

6. In the event that a NPLWA-W Club does not have sufficient Players to field an Under 21s and a First Team, the First Team will take priority.
7. In the event that a NPLWA-M Club does not have sufficient Players to field an Under 20s and a First Team, the First Team will take priority.
8. In the event that a NPLWA-M Club does not have sufficient Players to field an Under 18s and an Under 20s Team, the Under 20s Team will take priority.
9. Spectators are not permitted inside the barrier which separates the field of play from the rest of the venue while a Match is in progress.
10. Once Match schedules have been published, no changes may be made unless otherwise provided for in these Rules. A Club may request a Match change if it can demonstrate exceptional circumstances, in writing, not less than two (2) weeks prior to the scheduled kick-off date. This request may or may not be approved by Football West in its discretion. Any request for a Match change must be accompanied by written consent from the opposition Club.
11. A Club which has been granted a Match change in accordance with paragraph 10 is responsible for all costs associated with the rescheduled Match.
12. The home Club must provide one stretcher which is to be placed between the Technical Areas in a safe and accessible position. The stretcher must be in position before the commencement of the first Match of the day until the conclusion of the final Match of the day unless being utilised. A penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A.
13. Football West reserves the right to instruct home Clubs to increase the minimum-security arrangements for any Match at any time. The cost of any additional security arrangements is to be borne by the home Club.
14. Football West may appoint a Match commissioner at any NPLWA Match as its representative.
15. The Match commissioner must submit a report to Football West following each Match attended.
16. Should the Match commissioner report that a Club has breached any rules or regulations of Football West, then the Club may be sanctioned accordingly. A Match commissioner is classified as a Match Official with the same status as a Referee, assistant Referee, fourth official and Referee inspector.

Article 16 - Ground Marshals

1. The home Club must appoint ground marshals whose duties are:
 - a) to provide an escort for the Match Officials to and from the field of play at the start and finish of each playing period; and
 - b) to liaise with Club Officials and emergency services if required.
2. The home Club in a NPLWA-W fixture must provide at least two ground marshals for the Under 21s and First Team Match. Penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A.
3. The home Club in a NPLWA-M fixture must provide at least two ground marshals for each

Under 18s and Under 20s Match. Penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A.

4. The home Club in a NPLWA-M fixture must provide at least four ground marshals for each First Team Match. Penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A.
5. It is the responsibility of each Club to ensure that the ground marshals are fully briefed on their responsibilities.
6. All ground marshals must have access to all areas of the ground at all times. Ground marshals may not be limited to a specific location (for example, the person collecting gate fees may not be a ground marshal).
7. Ground marshals must be visible at all times.
8. Ground marshals may not smoke or drink alcohol while on duty.
9. All ground marshals must identify themselves to the appointed Referee at least fifteen minutes prior to the commencement of each Match.

Article 17 - Playing Kit Allocation

1. Each Club must nominate a home and alternative playing strip. The colours of the home strip's shirts and socks must be significantly different from those of the alternative strip.
2. Nomination for home and alternative playing strips must be submitted by **14 February 2022** in the format supplied by Football West. Penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A.
3. In any Match, if the shirts or socks of the participating Teams are alike or similar, or are in the opinion of the Referee likely to cause confusion, then Players of the away Team will be required to change its shirts or socks or both. In the event of any dispute regarding the strip to be worn by either Team, the Referee's decision is final.
4. All Teams must comply with the kit allocated by Football West for each relevant fixture. Penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A.

Article 18 - Match Balls

1. The home Club in each Senior NPLWA Match must provide the Referee with a minimum of three (3) Match balls no later than ten minutes prior to the commencement of the Match. All Senior NPLWA Matches must use the Football West designated ball. Three (3) Match balls will be provided free of charge to each Senior NPL Club for use by its senior Teams. Penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A.
2. All NPL Juniors Matches must use at least two (2) of Football West's designated ball. Two (2) Match balls will be provided free of charge to each Junior Team.
3. In NPL Juniors fixtures, the home Club will provide the Referee with two (2) Match balls no later than five (5) minutes prior to the commencement of the Match.

Article 19 - Match Officials

1. The home Club is responsible for the payment of all Match Official fees. Football West will determine the fees payable and publish the rates prior to the commencement of each Competition Season.
2. The allocation of Match Officials will be determined by Football West. No Club may request the attendance or non-attendance of any particular Match Official.
3. In the absence of one or both assistant Referees, each Team will provide a Club assistant Referee to assist the Referee. If either Club does not comply, then the Match may not proceed.
4. A Club must not refuse to allow an allocated Match Official to officiate at that allocated Match.
5. When a Match is forfeited by a Club, the Match Officials are entitled to receive 100% of the prescribed Match fee to be paid by the Club which forfeited the Match, unless the forfeiting Club informed Football West in writing at least 72 hours prior to the scheduled kick-off.
6. When a Match is abandoned, the Match Officials are entitled to receive 100% of the Match fee.

Article 20 - Representative Teams

1. If a Club has four (4) or more outfield Players or two (2) goalkeepers from one Team participating in a representative Match (all being "**Representative Players**"), it may seek the postponement of any Club Match which clashes with the representative Match.
2. To be considered as a qualifying Representative Player under paragraph 1, and subject to the conditions of paragraph 3, the relevant Representative Player must have been recorded on that Team's Electronic Match Cards for a minimum of 80% of all Matches up to and including the date of the request to postpone.
3. If a Representative Player is required to participate in a representative Match prior to round six of the Competitive Season, Football West may determine the Team that a Player is deemed to be registered with from the Electronic Match Cards available. Football West's decision in determining the Team of a Player is final.
4. Players must be released for training, preparation and participation for representative Matches when requested in writing to do so by Football West.
5. Football West may select a Player for a State Representative Team. A selected Player who has accepted selection who misses a State Representative Team session without a valid medical certificate (or other extenuating circumstances to be determined by Football West) will be suspended from his or her Club Team's next game. Football West reserves the right to determine the validity of any extenuating circumstances and any such decision is final.

Part 2 – NPLWA Men’s Competition

Article 21 - Qualification for Top Four Cup and National Finals

This Part 2 applies only to the NPLWA Men’s Competition

1. Teams will be ranked in their Divisions of the NPLWA Competition according to the number of Competition points that Team accrues over the Competitive Season as specified in Article 2.
2. The Teams which occupy the highest 4 positions in the First, Under 20s and Under 18s Divisions will compete in “The Top Four Cup”.
3. The Club whose First Team in the NPLWA Competition finishes in 1st place at the end of the Competitive Season will qualify for the National Finals Series. Should the NPLWA Perth Glory Team finish in first place at the end of the Regular Season, the Club whose First Team finishes in 2nd place will qualify for the National Finals Series.

Article 22 - Promotion and Relegation

1. Promotion and relegation refers to the processes set out in Articles 22 & 23 of these Rules and expressly excludes any restructure of the NPLWA-M Competition.
2. The NPLWA-M Club whose First Team finishes in last place at the end of the regular home and away season will occupy a relegation position.
3. Should the Club whose First Team finishes in first place in State League 1 meet the NPL Promotion Eligibility Criteria by the date stipulated for each criterion, the last placed NPLWA-M Club’s First Team, Under 20s and Under 18s age groups will be relegated to State League 1. The first placed State League 1 Club will be promoted to the NPLWA-M.
4. Should the Club whose First Team finishes in first place in State League 1 not meet the NPL Promotion Eligibility Criteria by the date stipulated for each criterion, the second placed Club if they meet the NPL Promotion Eligibility Criteria by the date stipulated for each criterion, will compete in a two-legged Promotion and Relegation Play-Off tie against the First Team of the last placed NPLWA-M Club as described in Article 23.
5. The NPL Promotion Eligibility Criteria, and the date by which each criterion must be met, are listed at Appendix C.
6. Football West will in its sole discretion determine whether or not a Club meets the NPL Promotion Eligibility Criteria.
7. For the avoidance of doubt, and despite anything stated in these Rules or the NPL Compliance Regulations, to be eligible for promotion to the NPLWA-M, a State League 1 Club is not required to meet any criteria other than those listed in Appendix C as the NPL Promotion Eligibility Criteria.
8. If neither Club in the top two positions in the State League Division 1 meets the NPL Promotion Eligibility Criteria, then no promotion will take place from the State League Division 1 to the NPLWA-M and no relegation will take place from the NPLWA-M to the State League Division 1.

Article 23 - Promotion and Relegation Play-Off

1. Should the circumstances described in Article 22.4 occur, the two relevant Clubs will take part in a promotion and relegation Play-Off.
 2. The Club that wins the Play-Off tie will earn the right to compete in the NPLWA-M Competition in the next Competitive Season and the First Team, Reserves and Under 18s age groups of the Club that loses the Play-Off tie will compete in State League 1 Competition.
 3. The Play-Off tie will be played under the following conditions:
 - a) the venue for each leg of a Match must comply with the standards as set out in Appendix B of the NPL Compliance Regulations. A Club whose regular home venue does not meet these requirements is responsible for arranging a compliant venue at its own cost; and
 - b) the State League 1 Club must comply with the following Rules in relation to the Player Points System and Visa Players:
 - i. a Player Roster must comprise at least 20 Players and no more than 23 Players. Player Rosters that do not comprise a number of Players in this range will not be accepted and will be deemed to be invalid;
 - ii. to be eligible to play in First Team Matches a Player must be on the Club's Player Roster, except for Players under the age of 20;
 - iii. each Player on the Player Roster will be assigned a points value in accordance with the Player Points System as promulgated by Football Australia from time to time. The State League 1 Club is entitled to a 20 point discount as provided for in the Player Point System;
 - iv. the total points value of all Players on the Player Roster as calculated in accordance with the Player Points System must not exceed 200. Rosters that have Player points totalling more than 200 will not be accepted and will be deemed to be invalid;
 - v. a Player must be registered on PlayFootball in accordance with the National Registration, Status and Transfer Regulations before he can be named on a Player Roster;
 - vi. a Player Roster is not official until it has been approved by Football West;
 - vii. for each non-Visa Player on the Player Roster, the Club must provide a copy of either:
 1. Australian Passport; or
 2. foreign Passport and permanent residency visa; or
 3. certificate of Australian Citizenship;
- and;
- viii. Article 25 (Visa Players) of these NPL Competition Rules.

4. The competition format of the Play-Off tie will be as follows:
 - a) The Play-Off tie will comprise two Matches, one Match played at each Club's home venue so each participating Club will have the benefit of a home Match. In circumstances where a Club's home venue is not available for whatever reason, that Club will be responsible for sourcing an alternative venue at its own cost (subject to approval in writing from Football West in its absolute discretion). The dates and times of the Play-Off Matches will be determined by Football West and may not be challenged by either Club participating in those Matches.
 - b) The order by which the Play-Off Matches will be played will be determined by Football West in its absolute discretion and not subject to review or challenge by a participating Club.

5. The winner of the Play-Off tie will be determined as follows:
 - a) The Club that scores the most goals over the two legs.
 - b) Should an equal number of goals over the two legs be scored by both Clubs, the winner of the Play-Off tie will be the Club that scores the most goals in its away leg. For the avoidance of doubt, the Club playing its away leg is the second-named Club in the Match, regardless of the venue at which the Match is played.
 - c) If a winner cannot be determined in accordance with paragraphs a) and b), then two periods of fifteen (15) minutes extra time per period will be played in accordance with the FIFA Laws of the Game at the conclusion of the second leg.
 - d) At the end of the second period of extra time, the winner of the Play-Off tie will be determined by reference to the provisions of paragraph a). The provisions of paragraph b) will not apply once the Match moves into extra time.
 - e) If a winner cannot be determined through the application of sub-paragraph d) , the winner of the Play-Off tie will be decided by kicks from the penalty mark as described in the FIFA Laws of the Game.

Article 24 - Player Rosters and Periods

1. Every Club must submit a draft of their Player Roster to Football West no later **than 10:00am WST on 1 February 2022**. Penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A.
2. Every Club must submit a valid Player Roster to Football West no later **than 10:00am WST on 7 February 2022**. Penalties for breach are as set out in Appendix A.
3. A Player Roster must comprise of at least 20 Players and no more than 23 Players. Football West will not accept Player Rosters that do not comprise of a number of Players within this range and those Player Roster's will be deemed to be invalid.
4. To be eligible to play in First Team Matches a Player must be on a Club's Player Roster, subject to

the exemption in paragraph 16.

5. Each Player on the Player Roster will be assigned a points value in accordance with the Player Points System as promulgated by Football Australia from time to time.
6. The total points value of all Players on the Player Roster as calculated in accordance with the Player Points System must not exceed 200. Rosters that have Player Points totalling more than 200 will not be accepted and will be deemed to be invalid.
7. A Player must be registered on PlayFootball in accordance with the National Registration, Status and Transfer Regulations before that Player can be named on a Player Roster. Football West may grant an exemption to this in exceptional circumstances.
8. If a Player has multiple FFA numbers or accounts on PlayFootball, their first created account's registration with a Club will be deemed to be the valid registration. If a Player intends to register with a later account they must inform Football West in writing or that account will not be considered valid until that Player do so.
9. A Player Roster is not official until it has been approved in writing by Football West.
10. For each non-Visa Player on the Player Roster, the Club must provide a copy of either:
 - a) an Australian Passport; or
 - b) a foreign Passport and permanent residency visa; or
 - c) a Certificate of Australian Citizenship.
11. Other forms of proof of citizenship or permanent residency status may be accepted by Football West in its absolute discretion.
12. Once submitted and approved by Football West, no Player may be added to a Club's Player Roster except:
 - a) before 10:00am WST on Monday 10 February 2022;
 - b) between 9:00am WST 21 June and 5:00pm WST 30 June 2022
 - c) in the case of a Player born in 2002 or later;
 - d) in the case of an amateur Player whose last registration is with a Club in Western Australia that does not have a Senior Team competing in the NPLWA Men's Competition and the Player has played at least 5 Matches for that Club in the current Competitive Season. Player Point System value will be determined by Football West;
 - e) in the case of an amateur Player previously registered outside Western Australia;
 - f) in accordance with the Long-Term Injury Policy; and
 - g) in the case where a Player originally listed on the Player Roster is removed in accordance with Paragraph 13, the Club may replace the Player with another Player registered for the Club's Under 20's or Under 18's as long as the replacement Player is already registered with the same Club.
13. Once submitted to and approved by Football West, no Player may be removed from a Club's Player Roster except:
 - a) before **10:00am WST on 7 February 2022**
 - b) between **9:00am WST 21 June** and **5:00pm WST Thursday 30 June**;

- c) when the Player is no longer registered with the Club they must be removed;
 - d) in the case of a Player who is unable to play in the NPL due to a change in work or personal circumstances accompanied by evidence acceptable to Football West; and
 - e) in accordance with the Long-Term Injury Policy.
14. A Player removed from a Club's Player Roster in accordance with paragraph 12(d) may not be added onto any Club's Player Roster later in the same season.
 15. No Player may be added to a Club's Player Points System outside of the transfer windows if their previous registration is with another NPL Club, regardless of any exceptions.
 16. Players born in 2002 or later may play for the First Team for an unlimited number of games during the 2022 season even if they are not on the Player Roster.

Article 25 - Visa Players

1. For the purpose of this Article, an Australian Player is any Player who is:
 - a) a citizen of Australia; or
 - b) a Permanent Resident of Australia (where Permanent Resident means a person resident in Australia on a "permanent" visa class issued by the Australian Government, evidenced by either the person's Visa Grant Notice or as a listed entitlement on the person's online Visa Entitlement Verification); or
 - c) the holder of a refugee visa, humanitarian visa or protection visa issued by the Australian Government.
2. A Visa Player is a Player who is not an Australian Player.
3. Each Club may name a maximum of 2 Visa Players on its Player Roster.
4. For each Visa Player on the Player Roster, the Club must provide Football West with a copy of the Foreign Passport with the Player's entry visa into Australia.

Article 26 - Match Documentation

1. Each Club must make available a Team List to the Referee on Match day. A copy of the Team List should be retained by the Club. Copies of the Team List must also be made available to:
 - a) the Opposition Club;
 - b) the home Club Media Officer;
 - c) the Football West Match Reporter; and
 - d) Football West's Videographer.
2. The Team List must contain the full names of each Player and non-playing officials who intend to occupy the Technical Area. For the avoidance of doubt, a Player or non-playing official whose name does not appear on the Team List may not enter the field of play, the surrounds of the field of play or the Technical Area while the Match is in progress.

3. All sections of the Team List must be completed including FA numbers, Team Officials and Team formation if applicable.
4. Non-playing officials who sit in the Technical Area during any NPLWA-M Match must be registered on PlayFootball. Penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A.
5. Only Players whose names appear on the Club's Player Roster may be listed on the Team List for the First Team with the exception of the circumstances detailed in Article 24 paragraph 16. Penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A.

Article 27 - Players

1. To be eligible to play in the NPLWA Men's Competition for any Club except Perth Glory, a Player must meet the following age criteria.
 - a) Under 18s Division – born in 2004, 2005, 2006 or 2007;
 - b) Under 20s Division – born 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005 or 2006 (subject to paragraph 2);
 - c) First Team Division – born in 2006 or earlier.
2. An Under 20s Team may include a maximum of 4 Players on the Team List who were born in 2001 or earlier for any Match. Each of these Players must be so denoted on the Team List with an asterisk next to each overage Player's name. Penalties for breach are as set out in Appendix A.
3. An overage Player playing for the Under 20's under paragraph 2 must be registered on the First Team Player Roster during the Registration Window before they are eligible to participate in First Team Matches.

Article 28 - Perth Glory Players

1. To be eligible to play in the NPLWA Men's Competition, every Perth Glory Player must meet the following age criteria.
 - a) Under 18s Division – born in 2004, 2005, 2006 or 2007;
 - b) Under 20s Division – born in 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005 or 2006;
 - c) First Team Division – born in , 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005 or 2006.
2. All Players on the Perth Glory First Team Player Roster must have a relationship between the Player and Club that complies with the National League Player Contracting Regulations.
3. The Perth Glory First Team on any one Match day may include at most 4 Players born between 1998 and 2002. Penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A.
4. The Perth Glory First Team may also include a maximum of 1 goalkeeper who was born in 2001 or earlier on the Team List for any Match provided that the goalkeeper has not started more than 2 A-League games in the previous season and provided that written approval is granted by both FA and Football West.
5. A Player born in 2001 or earlier must be contracted to Perth Glory on their First Team or as a

Scholarship Player.

Article 29 - Admission

1. A maximum of 69 people from the visiting Club must be provided with free entry to the venue for any one Match day for use by the Players, Club officials or a Club's official guests. The visiting Club must inform the home Club in writing the names to be granted free entry by noon on the last Business Day prior to the Match.
2. The Football West videographer and Match reporter for a NPLWA-M Match must be permitted to park inside the venue free of charge.
3. Any person, including a Match Official who is not appointed to the Match, who produces an official Football West pass must be granted free entry into any venue for any Match.
4. All Football West passes are valid only for Football West Matches and may be revoked by Football West at any time.
5. General entry admission fees may be charged up to the maximum amounts listed below:
 - a) General Entry - \$10
 - b) Students, Pensioners or concession holders with evidence of status - \$5
 - c) People under the age of 15 – Free
6. Any person who produces official media accreditation must be granted free entry into any venue for any Match. No Club may refuse admission to a person with the correct accreditation. Penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A.

Article 30 - Prize Money

1. The Club whose First Team in the NPLWA Men's Competition finishes in first position will receive \$12,000 prize money.
2. The Club whose First Team in the NPLWA Men's Competition finishes in second position will receive \$4,000 prize money.
3. The Club whose First Team in the NPLWA Men's Competition finishes in third position will receive \$2,000 prize money.
4. The Club whose First Team in the NPLWA Men's Competition finishes in fourth position will receive \$1,000 prize money.
5. Perth Glory FC is not eligible to win prize money. In the event that Perth Glory FC finishes in one of the top 4 positions, the prize money will be redistributed to include the 5th placed Team in the NPLWA Men's Competition.

Article 31 - Individual Awards

1. In accordance with paragraph 4, a Fairest and Best Award will be awarded to the best Player in each Division of the NPLWA Men's Competition.
2. A medal will be awarded to the Player born in 2002 or later who achieves the most votes in Senior First Team Matches, subject to the conditions set out in paragraph 6.
3. The Referee for each Match will award votes. Three votes will be awarded to the best Player, two votes to the next best Player and one vote awarded to the third best Player.
4. The Player who receives the most votes over the course of a Competition Season will win the Fairest and Best Award for their Division.
5. If two or more Players tie for the highest number of votes, then a prize will be awarded to each of those Players.
6. If a Player receives a suspension as a result of being shown a Red Card, or as a result of a sanction imposed by the Disciplinary & Grievance Tribunal or Football West during the Regular Season, he will be ineligible to win the Fairest and Best Award for that Competitive Season. For the avoidance of doubt, if that Player receives a Red Card which is subsequently rescinded as a result of mistaken identity or an obvious error, the Player will be eligible to win the Fairest and Best Award in accordance with the Disciplinary & Grievance Regulations.
7. An award will be presented to the Player who scores the most goals in each Division of NPLWA Men's Competition league Matches throughout the Competition Season of the. If two or more Players score an equal number of goals, an award will be presented to each of those Players.
8. Subject to paragraph 6, an award will be presented to the best First Team goalkeeper of the year based on votes cast by the Referees at each game of First Teams of the NPL. If two or more goalkeepers have an equal number of votes, an award will be presented to each of those Players.

Article 32 - Fair Play Award

1. Football West will present a Fair Play Award to the Club(s) whose NPLWA-M First Teams receive the fewest number of Penalty points during the Regular Season as determined by Football West. In addition to any other Penalty accrued for breaches of these Rules, Penalty points are accrued as follows:

a)	Each single Yellow Card issued	1 point
b)	Each indirect Red Card issued (two Yellow Cards to a single Player)	3 points
c)	Each direct Red Card issued	5 points
d)	Each non-playing official expelled from the Technical Area	5 points
e)	Five or more Players cautioned or sent off in a single Match	5 points
f)	Three or more Players sent off in a single Match	10 points
2. The winner of the Fair Play Award will receive \$2,000.
3. In the event that two or more Clubs receive the fewest Penalty points, the prize money will be shared evenly across those Clubs.

4. The Perth Glory FC Team competing in the NPLWA Men's Competition is not eligible to win the Fair Play Award. In the event that Perth Glory FC finishes the fewest number of Penalty points, the prize will be awarded to the 2nd placed Team.

Part 3 – NPLWA-M Top Four Cup

Article 33 – Competition Format

This Part applies to the Top Four Cup

1. The Teams that occupy the highest 4 positions in each of NPLWA-M Divisions, being the First Team Division, Under 20s Division and Under 18s Division, following the completion of the Regular Season will compete in the “Top Four Cup”.
2. The Matches of each Division of Top Four Cup will be structured as follows:

Match B	Team finishing 3 rd	vs	Team finishing 4 th
Match Day 2			
Match C	Loser of Match A	vs	Winner of Match B
Losing Team is eliminated

Grand Final	Winner of Match A	vs	Winner of Match C

3. The designated home Team of each Match is as follows:
 - a) Match A – the Team finishing 1st
 - b) Match B – the Team finishing 3rd
 - c) Match C – the losing Team of Match A
 - d) Grand Final – the winner of Match A
4. The venues and times of all Matches will be determined by Football West and communicated in writing to the participating Clubs.
5. For all Matches except the First Team Match, should scores be level at the full-time whistle, the outcome of the Matches will be decided by kicks from the Penalty mark as described in the FIFA Laws of the Game.
6. In the First Team Matches, should scores be level at the full-time whistle, two periods of extra time of fifteen (15) minutes per period will be played in accordance with the FIFA Laws of the Game.
7. Should scores be level at the end of the second period of extra time, the outcome of the Match will be decided by kicks from the Penalty mark as described in the FIFA Laws of the Game.
8. One additional substitute may be used when a Match goes into extra time (whether or not the Team has already used the full number of permitted substitutes).
9. The Grand Final winner in each age group will be known as Top Four Cup Winner.
10. The Club whose First Team wins the Grand Final of the Top Four Cup will receive \$10,000 prize money.

11. The Club whose First Team loses the Grand Final of the Top Four Cup will receive \$4,000 prize money.
12. The Club whose First Team loses Match C of the Top Four Cup will receive \$2,000 prize money.
13. The Club whose First Team loses Match B of the Top Four Cup will receive \$1,000 prize money.
14. No prize money will be awarded for the Under 20s or Under 18s.
15. Perth Glory FC is not eligible to win any prize money. Should Perth Glory qualify for the finals, Prize money will be distributed in a manner stipulated by Football West. Football West's decision on the redistribution of prize money under this paragraph is not subject to challenge.

Article 34 - Players

1. A Player must have played in a minimum of 5 Matches for a Club in the current season to be eligible to play in any of that Club's Teams in Top Four Cup, subject to other eligibility criteria.
2. A Player who has played in multiple age groups for a particular NPL Team in their Club is ineligible to participate in any Top Four Cup Matches in a lower age group than the highest age group Team for which he has played unless:
 - a) 50% or more of the Matches in which they have played are for a lower age group; or
 - b) They have played less than 5 Matches for a higher age group,

Penalties for breaches of each are as set out in Appendix A.

3. A Player will be exempt from the restrictions specified in paragraphs 1 and 2 if that Player is a goalkeeper, and the Club has applied in writing to Football West prior to the commencement of the Match and can establish in that application to the satisfaction of Football West that no other eligible goalkeeper is available to participate. Absence due to injury must be accompanied by a medical certificate at least 2 Business Days before the Match. Football West's decision on any application is final.
4. Once a Player has started for a Team in the Top Four Cup, they are no longer eligible to play in a lower age group Team other than the Team for which they have played for in the Top Four Cup.
5. In Senior Matches, an unused substitute is deemed not to have played.
6. A Player who accumulates 2 Yellow Cards in a post-season Competition or finals series must serve an Automatic Match Suspension of 1 Match as set out in the Disciplinary and Grievance Regulations.

Article 35 - Match Officials

1. The host Club will pay the Match Official fees for all of the Matches in the Top Four Cup.

Article 36 - Match Balls

1. The host Club will provide the Match balls for all Matches in the Top Four Cup except the Grand Finals. Football West will supply all Match balls for the Grand Finals.

Article 37 - Admission

1. A maximum of 23 people from each Team will be provided with a free entry pass to the venue for any one Match day for use by the Players, Club officials or a Club's official guests only. The visiting Club must inform the host Club in writing the names to be granted free entry by 12:00pm on the last Business Day prior to the Match.

Article 38 - Squad Lists

1. Football West reserves the right to request a squad list for each competing Team in a Match. If requested by Football West, the relevant Club must provide said squad list in writing four (4) Business Days prior to the Match.

Part 4 – NPLWA Women’s Competitions

Article 39 - Player Rosters and Periods

1. Every Club must submit a valid Player Roster Composition in writing to Football West no later than 10:00am WST on Monday 28 March 2022. Penalties for breach are as set out in Appendix A
2. A Player Roster Composition for any Team in the NPLWA Women’s Competition must comprise of at least 18 Players and no more than 23 Players. Rosters that do not comprise a number of Players in this range will not be accepted and will be deemed to be invalid.
3. A Player must be registered on PlayFootball in accordance with the National Registration, Status and Transfer Regulations before she can be named on a Player Roster Composition. Football West may grant an exemption to this requirement in exceptional circumstances.
4. A Player Roster Composition is not official until it has been approved in writing by Football West.
5. Once submitted to and approved by Football West, no Player may be added to a Club’s Player Roster Composition except:
 - a) before **10:00am WST on 28 March 2022**;
 - b) between **13 June 2022** and **21 June 2022**;
 - c) in the case of a Player born in 2001 or later who has played in more than 8 First Team Matches in the current season;
 - d) in the case of an amateur Player previously registered with a different Club in Western Australia that does not have a NPLWA-W Team;
 - e) in the case of an amateur Player previously registered outside Western Australia;
 - f) in accordance with the Long-Term Injury Policy; and
 - g) in the case a Player originally listed on the Player Roster Composition is removed in accordance with Paragraph 6 the Club may replace the Player with another Player registered for the Club's Under 21's as long as the replacement Player is already registered with the same Club.
6. Once submitted and approved by Football West, no Players may be removed from a Club’s Player Roster Composition except:
 - a) before **10:00am WST on 28 March 2022**;
 - b) between **13 June 2022** and **21 June 2022**;
 - c) when a player deregisters from the Club they must be removed;
 - d) in the case of a Player who is unable to play in the NPLWA-W due to a change in work or personal circumstances accompanied by evidence acceptable to Football West; and
 - e) in accordance with the Long-Term Injury Policy
7. A Player removed from a Club’s Player Roster Composition in accordance with paragraph 6(d) may not be added onto any Club’s Player Roster Composition later in the same season.
8. A Player removed from a Club’s Player Roster Composition in accordance with paragraph 6(e) may not play for an NPLWA-W Team until they have been placed on that Team’s Player Roster Composition.

9. No Player born in 2000 or earlier may be added to a Clubs Player Roster Composition outside of the transfer windows if their previous registration is with another NPLWA-W Club, regardless of any exceptions.
10. A Club's Player Roster Composition may not include more than three (3) W-League Players from the immediately preceding W-League season.
11. Football West may grant an exemption to the limit set out in paragraph 10 on application in writing by a Club if that Club can show exceptional reasons (as determined by Football West, in its discretion) as to why this limit should not apply. A Hyundai Football West NTC Team will have a presumption that exceptional reasons exist in relation to this limit.

Article 40 – Team Lists

1. Each Club must submit a Team Sheet to the Referee on Match day. A copy of the Team Sheet should be retained by the Club. Copies of the Team Sheet must also be provided to:
 - a) the opposition Club;
 - b) the home Club Media Officer;
 - c) Football West's Match Reporter; and
 - d) Football West's Videographer.
2. The Team Sheet must contain the full names of Players and non-playing officials who intend to occupy the Technical Area. For the avoidance of doubt, a Player or non-playing official whose name does not appear on the Team List may not enter the field of play, the surrounds of the field of play or the Technical Area while the Match is in progress.
3. All sections of the Team Sheet must be completed including FA numbers, Team Officials and Team formation if applicable.
4. Non-playing officials who sit in the Technical Area during any NPLWA-W Match must be registered on PlayFootball. Penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A.
5. Only Players whose names appear on the Player Roster Composition may be listed on the Team list of the First Team with the exception of the circumstances detailed in paragraph 6. Penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A.
6. A Club may promote a Player from its NPLWA-W Under 21s Team to play for its First Team up to a maximum of 8 Matches throughout an NPLWA-W season without being required to include such a Player on the First Team Player Roster Composition. Any such Player must meet the age eligibility criteria of the Team from which she is being promoted.
7. Once an Under 21s Player has played 8 Matches for the First Team in a single NPLWA-W season, the Player must be included on the NPLWA-W Club's First Team Player Roster before she is eligible to play her ninth Match. For the avoidance of doubt, an unused substitute is deemed not to have played.
8. A Club may promote an overage Player from its NPLWA-W Under 21s Team to play for its First Team up to a maximum of 4 Matches throughout an NPLWA-W season without being required to include such a Player on the First Team Player Roster Composition.

9. Once an overage Under 21s Player has played 4 Matches for the First Team in a single NPLWA-W season, the Player must be included on the NPLWA-W Club's First Team Player Roster Composition in accordance with Article 39 before she is eligible to play her fifth Match. For the avoidance of doubt, an unused substitute is deemed not to have played.
10. A Club may promote a Player from its Women's Amateur League Team to play for its First Team up to a maximum of 4 Matches throughout an NPLWA-W season without being required to include such a Player on the First Team Player Roster Composition.
11. Once a Women's Amateur League Player has played 4 Matches for the First Team in a single NPLWA-W season, the Player must be included on the NPLWA-W Club's First Team Player Roster Composition in accordance with Article 39 before she is eligible to play her fifth Match. For the avoidance of doubt, an unused substitute is deemed not to have played.

Article 41 - Players

1. To be eligible to play in the NPLWA-W for any Club, a Player must meet the following age criteria.
 - a) Under 21s – born 2001-2006 inclusive (subject to paragraph 2);
 - b) First Team – born in 2006 or earlier.
 - c) A Player who was born in 2007 or later may apply to Football West to be assessed as being competent to play in the NPLWA-W, but is ineligible to play until such competency has been provided to the Club in writing.
2. Only female Players are eligible to compete in the NPLWA-W. Penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A.
3. An Under 21s Team may include a maximum of four (4) Players who were born in 2000 or earlier on the Team list for any Match. Each of these Players must be so denoted on the Team list with an asterisk next to each overage Player's name. Penalties for breaches are as set out in Appendix A.
4. A Player who was in the starting Team or who took the field as a substitute in five (5) or more fixtures in the most recent W-League season may not play for any Team in the Women's Leagues except for a Club's NPLWA-W First Team and Under 21s.
5. A Player on a W-League Roster may not play for any Team in the Women's League except for a Club's NPLWA-W Teams.
6. Once a Player has played for the NPLWA-W First Team, she may not participate in the Women's Metropolitan League in the same season. As a goalkeeper is a specialised position, goalkeepers are exempt from this Rule but must only participate as a goalkeeper in the Women's Metropolitan league only.
7. Once a Player has taken the field for a Team of the NPLWA-W First Team on five (5) occasions, she may not participate in any Matches for any other Team in the Women's Amateur League for the remainder of the season.
8. A Player who has taken to the field for the NPLWA-W First Team, may not be listed on the Team list of a Team in the Women's Amateur League on the same Weekend.

9. Once a Player has been listed on a Match Card of the NPLWA-W Under 21s on six (6) occasions, she may not appear on the Team List of any Team in the Women's Metropolitan League for the remainder of the season.
10. Once a Player has been listed on a Match Card of the NPLWA-M Competition on six (6) occasions for any Team, she may not appear on the Team List of any Team in the NPLWA-W for the remainder of the season.

Article 42 - Admission

1. A maximum of 46 people from the visiting Club must be provided with free entry to the venue for any one Match day for use by the Players, Club officials or a Club's official guests. The visiting Club must inform the home Club in writing the names to be granted free entry by noon on the last working day prior to the Match.
2. The Football West videographer and Match reporter for an NPLWA-W Match must be permitted to park inside the venue free of charge.
3. Any person, including a Match Official who is not appointed to the Match, who produces an official Football West pass must be granted free entry into any venue for any Match.
4. All Football West passes are valid only for Football West Matches and may be revoked by Football West at any time.
5. General entry admission fees may be charged to the maximum amounts listed below:
 - a) General Entry - \$10.
 - b) Students, Pensioners or concession holders with evidence of status - \$5.
 - c) People under the age of 15 – Free entry.
6. Any person who produces official Sportradar accreditation must be granted free entry into any venue for any Match. No Club may refuse admission to a person with the correct accreditation. Penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A.

Article 43 - Prize Money

1. The Club whose First Team in the NPLWA Women's Competition finishes in first position will receive \$12,000 prize money.
2. The Club whose First Team in the NPLWA Women's Competition finishes in second position will receive \$4,000 prize money.
3. The Club whose First Team in the NPLWA Women's Competition finishes in third position will receive \$2,000 prize money.
4. The Club whose First Team in the NPLWA Women's Competition finishes in fourth position will

receive \$1,000 prize money.

5. Hyundai Football West NTC is not eligible to win any prize money. Should Hyundai Football West NTC qualify for the finals, prize money will be distributed in a manner stipulated by Football West. Football West's decision on the redistribution of prize money under this paragraph is not subject to challenge.

Article 44 - Individual Awards

1. In accordance with paragraph 4, a Fairest and Best prize will be awarded to the best Player in each of the First Team and Under 21s divisions.
2. The Referee for each Match will award votes. Three votes will be awarded to the best Player, two votes to the next best Player and one vote awarded to the third best Player.
3. Football West will at the conclusion of the season invite each First Team coach to submit votes for their top three players of the season who do not play for their own Club. These votes will be weighted by Football West and added to the Referees votes. For clarity each coaches' votes will be worth the same amount as the Referees.
4. The Player who receives the most votes over the course of the season will win the Fairest and Best prize for her Division.
5. If two or more Players tie for the highest number of votes, then a prize will be awarded to each of those Players.
6. A medal will be awarded to the Player born in 2002 or later who achieves the most votes in Senior First Team Matches, subject to the conditions in paragraph 7.
7. If a Player receives a suspension as a result of being shown a Red Card, or as a result of a sanction imposed by the Disciplinary & Grievance Tribunal during the Competitive Season, she will be ineligible to win the Fairest and Best Award for that Season. For the avoidance of doubt, if that Player receives a Red Card which is subsequently rescinded as a result of mistaken identity, the Player will be eligible to win the Fairest and Best Award.
8. An award will be presented to the Player who scores the most goals in each Division in league Matches throughout the season of the NPLWA-W. If two or more Players score an equal number of goals, an award will be presented to each of those Players.
9. Subject to paragraph 7, an award will be presented to the best First Team goalkeeper of the year based on votes cast by the Referees at each game in the First Team of the NPLWA-W. If two or more goalkeepers have an equal number of votes, an award will be presented to each of those Players.

Article 45 - Fair Play Award

1. Football West will present a Fair Play Award to the Clubs whose NPLWA-W First Teams

receive the fewest number of Penalty points during the regular season. In addition to any other Penalty accrued for breaches of these Rules, Penalty points are accrued according to the following:

Article 46 - Competition Format

1. The Teams that occupy the highest 4 positions of each NPLWA-W Division (First Team and Under 21s) following the completion of the regular season will compete in the Top Four Cup.
2. The Matches of each Division of Top Four Cup will be structured as follows:

3. The designated home Team of each Match is as follows:
 - a) Match A – the Team finishing 1st
 - b) Match B – the Team finishing 3rd
 - c) Match C – the losing Team of Match A

4. The venues and times of all Matches will be determined by Football West and communicated to the participating Clubs.
5. For all Matches in the Top Four Cup except the First Team Match, should scores be level at the full-time whistle, the outcome of the Matches will be decided by kicks from the Penalty mark as described in the FIFA Laws of the Game.
6. In the First Team Matches of the Top Four Cup, should scores be level at the full-time whistle, two periods of extra time of fifteen (15) minutes per period will be played in accordance with the FIFA Laws of the Game.
7. Should scores be level at the end of the second period of extra time, the outcome of the Match will be decided by kicks from the Penalty mark as described in the FIFA Laws of the Game.
8. One additional substitute may be used when a Match goes into extra time (whether or not the Team has already used the full number of permitted substitutes).
9. The Grand Final winner will be known as Top Four Cup Winner.
10. The Club whose First Team in the Top Four Cup wins the Grand Final will receive \$10,000 prize money.

11. The Club whose First Team in the Top Four Cup loses the Grand Final will receive \$4,000 prize money.
12. The Club whose First Team in the Top Four Cup loses Match C will receive \$2,000 prize money.
13. The Club whose First Team in the Top Four Cup loses Match B will receive \$1,000 prize money.
14. Hyundai Football West NTC is not eligible to win any prize money. Should Hyundai Football West NTC qualify for the finals, prize money will be distributed in a manner stipulated by Football West. Football West's decision on the redistribution of prize money under this paragraph is not subject to challenge.

Article 47 - Players

1. A Player must have played in a minimum of five (5) Matches for a Club in the current season to be eligible to play in any of that Club's Teams in the Top Four Cup, subject to other eligibility criteria set out in this Article 47.
2. A Player who has played in 6 or more Matches for the NPLWA-W First Team in her Club is ineligible to participate in any Top Four Cup Matches in the Under 21s Team unless they have played more than 50% of their matches for the Under 21s Team. Penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A
3. A Player will be exempt from the restrictions specified in paragraphs 1 and 2 if that Player is a goalkeeper, and the Club has applied in writing to Football West prior to the commencement of the Match and can establish in that application to the satisfaction of Football West that no other eligible goalkeeper is available to participate. Absence due to injury must be accompanied by a medical certificate at least two (2) Business Days before the Match. Football West's decision on any application is final.
4. Once a Player has started for the First Team in the Top Four Cup they are no longer eligible to play in the Under 21s Team for which they have previously played in the Top Four Cup.
5. An unused substitute during an NPLWA-W fixture is deemed NOT to have played.
6. A Player who accumulates two (2) Yellow Cards in a post-season Competition or finals series must serve an Automatic Match Suspension of one (1) Match as set out in the D&G Regulations.

Article 48 - Match Officials

1. The host Club will pay the Match Official fees of the Matches played in the Top Four Cup.

Article 49 - Match Balls

1. The host Club will provide the Match balls for all senior Matches except the Grand Finals. Football

West will supply all Match balls for the Grand Finals.

Article 50 - Admission

1. A maximum of 23 people from each Team will be provided with a free entry pass to the venue for any one Match Day for use by the Players, Club officials or a Club's official guests only. The visiting Clubs must inform the host Club in writing the names to be granted free entry by 12:00pm on the last working day prior to the Match.

Article 51 - Squad Lists

1. Football West reserves the right to request a squad list for each competing Team in a Match. If requested by Football West, the relevant Club must provide said squad list in writing four (4) Business Days prior to the Match.

Part 6 – Junior Teams

Article 52 - Competition Format

1. Teams will be allocated into three (3) Conferences for the first seven (7) rounds of the season before being separated into 2 Divisions.
2. The first 7 rounds of the season will be referred to as the conference phase (**Conference Phase**) and the remaining League Matches will be referred to as the division phase (**Division Phase**).
3. A Club will be placed in the Conferences according to that Club's overall ranking in the previous season.
4. Teams will be placed in Divisions according to that Team's results in the Conference Phase.
5. Teams will be ranked in their Conferences and Divisions according to the number of Competition points they accrue over the season. The order in which Teams finish the Competition will be determined by the criteria specified in Article 2.
6. During the Conference Phase there will be an inter-conference Match between the two Clubs that are most closely ranked in accordance with paragraph 3.
7. Matches played in accordance with paragraph 6 will count as a Match played in each Team's Conference. For clarity this means that the Match is competitive and that Competition Points will be awarded for this Match based on the result.
8. During the Divisional Phase no Competition Points for inter-divisional Matches will be awarded.

Article 53 - Junior Matches

1. Junior Matches must be held in accordance with the Football West Match Scheduling Policy.
2. The home Club must provide one stretcher per venue which is to be placed in a safe and accessible position. The stretcher must be in position before the commencement of the first Match of the day until the conclusion of the final Match of the day unless being utilised.
3. Each Team must have a first aid kit available at the venue on the date of the Match.
4. Spectators may only watch the Match from behind the touch line. For the avoidance of doubt, the home Club must ensure that no spectators are situated behind the goal line while the Match is in progress.

Article 54 - Modifications to the Laws of the Game

1. Matches in the Under 13s and Under 14s age groups will be played over two equal periods of 30 minutes. With the exception of abandoned Matches, each period must last for a minimum of 20 minutes for a result to be recorded.

2. Matches in the Under 15s age group will be played over two equal periods of 35 minutes. With the exception of abandoned Matches, each period must last for a minimum of 25 minutes for a result to be recorded.
3. Matches in the Under 16s age group will be played over two equal periods of 40 minutes. With the exception of abandoned Matches, each period must last for a minimum of 25 minutes for a result to be recorded.
4. Substitutes in junior Matches are not bound by the condition in Law 3 of the Laws of the Game forbidding further participation in the Match. All substitutes in NPL Juniors Matches are able to be substituted on and off the field of play on multiple occasions. All such substitutions must take place at the halfway line.
5. The duration of the half time interval will be (five) 5 minutes.
6. No more than five named substitutes may be listed on the Team list of which a maximum of five may be used in any one Match.
7. Matches in the Under 13s age group must use a size 4 football.
8. The Referee must adjust the duration of a Match to ensure that a following Match on the same field of play commences at the scheduled kick-off time.
9. When a Match is shortened in accordance with paragraph 8, each Match Official is entitled to receive the full amount of their normal Match fee.
10. No time may be added to the end of each period in NPL Juniors Matches for stoppages or injuries.
11. The Referee has the power to show yellow or Red Cards and temporarily dismiss a Player during NPL Juniors Matches.
12. Temporary Dismissal System B as defined in the FIFA Laws of the Game shall apply only to the cautionable offence of dissent by word or action.
13. A Player who is cautioned for dissent by word or action will be punished by a temporary dismissal period of 10 minutes for Matches greater than 60 minutes in duration or five (5) for Matches of 60 minutes or less in duration.
14. Temporary Dismissals are not recorded on the Match card submitted by the Referee and do not count towards accumulation of cautions.
15. In the event of a technical error in the Laws of the Game by the Referee with regard to temporary dismissals, the decision made by the Referee is final.
16. All Clubs must have a Technical Area marked at all NPL Juniors Matches

Article 55 - Ground Marshals

1. Each Club must appoint ground marshals whose duties are:
 - a) to liaise with Club officials and emergency services if required; and

- b) to ensure the security of the venue, Players, Match Referees and Club officials.
2. If the Club is using one field of play on a Match date, the Club must appoint at least one ground marshal.
 3. If the Club is using more than one field of play on a Match date, the Club must appoint at least two ground marshals.
 4. Neither the coach nor manager of a Team involved in a Match may act as ground marshal for that Match.
 5. It is the responsibility of each Club to ensure that the ground marshals are fully briefed on their responsibilities.
 6. All ground marshals must have access to all areas of the ground at all times. Ground marshals may not be limited to a specific location (for example, the person working in a canteen may not be a ground marshal).
 7. Ground marshals must be visible at all times.
 8. The ground marshals may not smoke or drink alcohol while on duty.
 9. All ground marshals must identify themselves to the appointed Match Referee, if present, at least five minutes prior to the commencement of each Match.

Article 56 - Match Documentation

1. A Player whose name appears on an Electronic Match Card is deemed to have played in the Match.
2. Team Sheets are to include columns for Shirt number, Name, FA number, Goals, Yellow cards and Red cards.
3. The Referee must complete a Match report according to the instructions dictated by the Referees Technical Committee. Such reports are to be lodged with Football West within 2 Business Days of the completion of the Match.
4. The result of each Match must be entered into SportsTG by the home Club within 2 hours of the completion of the match.

Penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A.

Article 57 - Players

1. Player players are eligible to play in the specified age group if they were born in the years listed for their gender:

Under 14s	2008, 2009 or 2010*	2007, 2008 2009 or 2010*

Under 16s	2006, 2007 or 2008*	2005, 2006, 2007 or 2008*

*Birth years marked with a star will require an exemption from Football West as set out in paragraph 2 to participate in that age group.

2. Regardless of the eligible years above, which create a presumption that a player may participate in those age groups, a Player seeking to participate in an age group more than one year older than their actual age, i.e. a 13 year old seeking to play Under 15s, must be made in writing to Football West in accordance with the Football West Playing Out of Age Group Process. Such a request may be granted after the Player has been assessed by Football West. The Player is ineligible to participate in the requested age group until written approval has been received from Football West.
3. A male Player may not under any circumstances compete in an age group lower than that for which he is eligible.
4. Once a Player has taken the field of play in ten (10) Matches of NPLWA-M, State League or Amateur Competition in the Under 18s, Under 20s/Reserves or First Team, they are no longer eligible to participate in the NPL Juniors and the Junior Boys League during the same season.
 - a) In the NPLWA-M these Senior Matches may comprise any combination of First Team, Under 20s and 18s Team Matches as long as no more than nine (9) Under 18s Matches, no more than five (5) Under 20s/Reserves Matches and no more than one (1) first Team NPL Match is played.
 - b) In the State League These Senior Matches may comprise any combination of First Team, Reserves and 18s Team Matches as long as no more than nine (9) Under 18s Matches, no more than five (5) Under 20s/Reserves Matches or three (3) First Team Matches.
 - c) Following reaching the limits on Matches described in (a) and (b) or the ninth (9th) Match for the senior Teams, a Player must choose to play in either the NPL Seniors/State League/Amateurs or NPL Juniors and the Junior Boys Team(s) for which they are eligible.
5. A maximum of two (2) Players may play in the next lowest ranked Team in a lower division to that in which those Players normally play including the case where a Player's normal Team is in the NPL. If there is disagreement about the Team in which any such Player normally plays, Football West will make a determination and any such determination is final. For the avoidance of doubt, a Player may not play in a Team which is below the Club's next lowest ranked Team under any circumstances. "The next lowest ranked Team" is defined as either the NPL Team in the age group immediately below the Player's normal Team or the highest ranked junior Team in the same age group that is not an NPL Team.

Penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A.

6. A Player will be deemed an NPL Player if they have appeared on the Electronic Match Card of their Club's NPL Teams on at least 50% of Matches played by that Player to that date or if they are on an NPL Club's Player Roster.
7. A Player may not play in any age group of the NPL and any age group of the Junior Boys League on the same weekend. Penalty for breach is as set out in Appendix A.
8. An NPL Player may not play in any division below Junior League-Division 3 under any circumstances.
9. NPL Clubs must not register more than sixteen (16) Players per age group

Article 58 – Player Rosters and Movement

1. Each Club must submit a valid Player Roster for each Team by **10:00am WST 30 March 2022**. Penalty for breaches is as set out in Appendix A.
2. Each Age Group must have a Player Roster consisting of a minimum of 14 Players and a maximum of 16 Players.
3. A Player Roster must be valid at all times during the season and if Player movements result in an invalid Player Roster, then the Club must remedy this before their next Match in accordance with paragraph 10 and 11.
4. A Player must be on a Club's roster in the relevant age group, subject to Paragraph 5 and 6, to be eligible to play for that age group.
5. A Player may play in one age group higher or lower than the roster that this Player is on, subject to the age requirements set out in Article 57.
6. A Player may play a maximum of five (5) matches for a Team before they must be added to the Club's roster.
7. A Player may move between NPL Juniors Clubs and play in the NPL Juniors for the remainder of the season as long as they move **before 12:01pm on 29 April 2022**.
8. A Player who has previously been on a different Club's Roster and registers with a new Club after **12:01pm on 29 April 2022** as set out in Article 52 may not play NPL Juniors for this new Club.
9. Exemptions may be granted to paragraphs 7 and 8 at the sole discretion of Football West.
10. A Player may be added to the Player Roster of a NPL Juniors Club:
 - a) **before 12:01pm WST on 29 April 2022**;
 - b) in the case of an amateur Player previously registered with a different Club in Western Australia that does not have a NPL Juniors Team;
 - c) in the case of an amateur Player who has not been registered with a different Club in Western Australia in 2022;
 - d) in the case of an amateur Player previously registered outside Western Australia; and

e) in accordance with the Long-Term Injury Policy.

11. A player may be removed from the Roster:
 - a) before 12:01pm WST on 29 April 2022;
 - b) when a player deregisters from the Club they must be removed;
 - c) in the case of a Player who is unable to play in the NPL Juniors due to a change in work or personal circumstances accompanied by evidence acceptable to Football West; and
 - d) in accordance with the Long-Term Injury Policy.
12. A Team without a valid Roster will be deemed to forfeit any Matches scheduled until a compliant Roster is submitted.

Article 59 - Match Officials

1. Each Club is responsible for a 50% proportion of the relevant Match Official fees. Football West will determine the fees payable and publish the rates on its website or by another method of its choosing prior to the commencement of each Competition Season.
2. Match official fees are payable in cash to the Match Official(s) on the day of the Match.
3. The allocation of Match Officials will be determined by Football West. No Club may request the attendance or non-attendance of any particular Match Official.
4. In the event that a Referee is not allocated to the Match by Football West, or that none of the Match Officials allocated to a Match is ready and able to commence the Match within fifteen (15) minutes of the scheduled kick-off time, then the home Club will allocate a Referee.
5. If a Referee is appointed by the home Club in accordance with paragraph 4, that Referee must be at least two years older than the age group of the Match in the year of Competition.
6. In the absence of one or both assistant Referees, each Team will provide a Club assistant Referee to assist the Match Referee. If either Club does not comply, then the Match may not proceed.
7. If the appointed Referee suspends or delays any Match that is not completed on the scheduled day, he must submit a report in writing to Football West within three (3) Business Days of the scheduled conclusion of the Match outlining the reasons for their actions. The appointed Referee is entitled to 50% of the prescribed Match fee for a suspended or delayed Match and 100% of the Match fee for a suspended or delayed Match, which is subsequently completed or abandoned.
8. When a Match is forfeited by a Club, the Referee is entitled to receive 100% of the prescribed Match fee to be paid by the Club which forfeited the Match, unless the forfeiting Club informed Football West in writing at least 72 hours prior to the scheduled kick-off.
9. When a Match is abandoned, the Match Officials are entitled to receive the full amount of their normal Match fees.

Appendix C - NPL Promotion Eligibility Criteria

1. All of the following criteria must be satisfied, and proof must be provided to Football West by a State League 1 Club on or before the dates stipulated in this Appendix C in order for the Club to be eligible for promotion to the NPL.
2. Football West will assess whether a Club has met the NPL Promotion Eligibility Criteria and inform the Club of the result of its assessment within 5 business days of the date by which each criterion is required to be met.
3. Football West will inform all NPL and relevant State League 1 Clubs as soon as practicable which of the State League 1 Clubs are eligible for promotion to the NPL.
4. Football West may, in its absolute discretion, allow an exemption to compliance with any of these criteria or the dates by which any of the criteria must be satisfied.

NPLW WA Club First Team PRC Requirements

- At all times during the season, a NPLWA-W Club must include a minimum of 18 Players on its First Team Player Roster and may include a maximum of 23 Players on its First Team Player Roster.
- A NPLWA-W Club may promote a Player from its NPL Under 21s to play for its First Team for up to a maximum of 6 matches throughout the NPLWA-W season without being required to include that Player on the First Team Player Roster. In order for that Player to be eligible to play in more than 6 First Team matches in that NPLWA-W season, the Player must be included on the NPLWA-W Club's First Team Player Roster.
- Any player who is on the NPLWA-W Player Roster of a club cannot play in a competition outside of the NPLWA-W for that club.
- Clubs can make changes to their Player Roster in the designated transfer windows and as per competition rules.
- Once a player has played in 6 NPLWA-W matches (First Team or Under 21s), they cannot return to their original competition for that club.
- W-League and U19 NTC graduates (within 1 year) need to be listed on the NPLWA-W First Team player roster.
- Playing in a Match is defined as taking the field of play (i.e., in the starting 11 or entering the field as a substitute). For the avoidance of doubt, it will not constitute playing a match if the Player remains as a substitute and does not enter the field of play.
- NTC are exempt from Player Roster requirements.
- Football West has the right to determine in its sole and absolute discretion as to what category a Player falls under for the purposes of the Player Roster.

Notes and Definitions:

Characteristics:

- A Player may fulfil multiple categories simultaneously i.e. A player may be classified as a Matilda and a W-League Player on a Player Roster.

Age:

- A Player's age is based on their age as of 31st December in that NPLWA-W competition season.
- All Players on the Player Roster and competing in the NPLWA-W competition must as a minimum turn 15 years of age by 31 December in that competition season. This is subject to any exemption requirements set out in the NPLWA Competition Rules.

W-League Players:

- For the purpose of the Player Roster, a player registered to a W-League club in the preceding W-League season will be classified as a W-League player.
- For the purpose of the Player Roster a W-League appearance is defined as a player who started or took the field as a substitute in a W-League fixture in the preceding W-League season.
- For the purpose of the PRC the preceding W-League season refers to the 2021/2022 season.

Visa Players:

- Any player who is not an Australian Citizen or does not have Permanent Residency status is considered a Visa Player.
