Football West continues its partnership with the Insurance Commission of Western Australia to deliver the Belt Up NAIDOC Ball Design competition to promote seat belt safety. Together, we invite the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community to create a design which will be printed onto footballs and distributed to clubs, schools and community organisations across the State. We wish to acknowledge and celebrate the traditional owners of this land and the role they play in the football community.

NAIDOC Week celebrations are held throughout Australia in July to celebrate and acknowledge the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

The Insurance Commission aims to promote awareness throughout the community about the importance of wearing a seat belt. Its Belt Up road safety campaign has a key focus on regional WA, which is overrepresented in motor injury insurance claims, and specifically not wearing a seat belt.

Use the ball template provided to create a design celebrating the 2023 NAIDOC Week.




The competition is open exclusively to the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community and closes 12pm AWST 14 November 2022.


